Dear Brothers and Friends,

# PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE BYLAWS OF SWOPE PARK LODGE #617 A.F. & A.M.

The proposed changes to the existing ByLaws as of July, 2000 are listed, along with the existing ByLaws for comparison. The ByLaws committee recommends these changes be adopted as proposed.

TO THE WORSHIPFUL MASTER, WARDENS, OFFICERS AND BRETHREN OF

SWOPE PARK LODGE #617 A.F. & A.M.
Proposed changes to the By-Laws of SWOPE PARK LODGE
#617 A.F. & A.M.

All changes recommended by the By-Laws Committee are explained as follows:

Where words or phrases are to be deleted they are shown with a line through them. All additions are shown in **bold Italics**.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT: The By-Laws of Swope Park Lodge # 617 A.F. & A.M. be amended as follows:

ARTICLE II MEETINGS

### DELETE in its entirety, MEETINGS, SECTION 1.1, NO SMOKING.

No smoking is allowed in the building while Swope Park Lodge #617 is having activities.

Statement of purpose:

This committee is of the opinion that since the brethren who smoke are conscientious and respect the non-smoking brethren and have endeavored to segregate themselves from the non-smokers, we believe this accommodates all brethren. Should the occasion arise where a brother is on oxygen or we have a large meeting, the Worshipful Master can order a no smoking rule for the dining area for that night.

### AMEND SECTION 3. SPECIAL MEETINGS AND NOTICES to read:

Special Communications of the Lodge shall be held by call of the Worshipful Master. Notice of each Special Communication shall be published in a Kansas City daily newspaper not later than the day before the meeting, or notice by mail to all resident members not less than ten (10) days before the meeting, or announcement at the next preceding Stated Communication duly recorded in the minutes of such meeting, all stating the purpose, place, date and hour of said Special Communication.

Statement of purpose:

This change makes the By-Law conform to Grand Lodge Law.

**AMEND SECTION 2. ELECTION, WHEN HELD AND TERM OF OFFICE to read:** 

SECTION 2. ELECTION, WHEN HELD, INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS AND FISCAL YEAR

### Statement of purpose:

This change correctly reflects the content of SECTION 2.

AMEND SECTION 3. OFFICERS, HOW ELECTED to read:

AMEND SECTION 2. ELECTION, WHEN HELD AND TERM OF OFFICE to read:

Statement of purpose:

This change correctly reflects the content of SECTION 2.

AMEND SECTION 3. OFFICERS, HOW ELECTED to read:

SECTION 3. OFFICERS, HOW ELECTED AND TERM OF OFFICE

Statement of purpose:

This change correctly reflects the content of SECTION 2.

## ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF OFFICERS

#### AMEND SECTION 2. TREASURER

(g) For these services faithfully performed, he shall receive the sum of Fifteen Dollars (\$45.00) per month or \$45.00/quarter.

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(a) For these services faithfully performed, he shall receive the sum of *Twenty* Dollars (\$20.00) per month or \$60.00/quarter.

Statement of purpose:

This Office has not had a raise in over 10 years. Approximately 8 hours/month are spent on Lodge cost accounting and making deposits. Also the cost of driving has increased drastically. The \$5.00/month increase does not cover inflation since the last increase.

## AMEND SECTION 3. SECRETARY

(k) To prepare and submit to the Lodge on the first required Communication of each Fiscal Year, a complete statement of all transactions of the Secretaries office during the preceding Fiscal Year.

To read:

(k) To prepare and submit to the Lodge on the first regular Communication of each Fiscal Year, a complete statement of all transactions of the Secretaries office during the preceding Fiscal Year.

Statement of purpose:

The word "required" can be interpreted many different ways. The Grand Lodge By-Laws uses the word "regular".

(m) For these services faithfully performed, he shall receive the sum of One Hundred Forty Five Dollars (\$145.00) to be paid to him quarterly.

#### To read:

(I) For these services faithfully performed, he shall receive the sum of One Hundred *Sixty* Dollars (\$460.00) to be paid to him quarterly.

### Statement of purpose:

This is essentially the same as the Treasurer.

### ARTICLE VI COMMITTEES

### AMEND SECTION 1. STANDING COMMITTEES

(c) A Budget Committee consisting of the Worshipful Master, Treasurer, Secretary and two (2) members appointed by the Worshipful Master. It shall be the duty of the Budget Committee to budget all expenses of said Lodge for the ensuing year. It shall include among the liabilities of the Lodge the Per Capita Tax owing by the Lodge to the Grand Lodge. Such Budget shall be reported at the second communication after the installation of the Worshipful Master and Wardens and upon a vote of two thirds (2/3) of the members present at any Stated Communication. It shall be the duty of this committee to submit the Budget to the Lodge.

To read:

(c) A Budget Committee consisting of the Worshipful Master,
Treasurer, Secretary and two (2) members appointed by the
Worshipful Master. It shall be the duty of the Budget Committee
to budget all expenses of said Lodge for the ensuing fiscal year
and submitting the proposed Budget to the Lodge for
approval. It shall include among the liabilities of the Lodge the
Per Capita Tax and other assessments owing by the Lodge to
the Grand Lodge. Such Budget shall be reported at the second
communication after the installation of the Worshipful Master and
Wardens and affirmed by a two-thirds (2/3) majority aye vote of
the members present at any Stated Communication. The Lodge
Budget may be amended at any time during the fiscal year by
motion, seconded, approval by the Budget Committee and
affirmed by a majority aye vote of the members present at
any Stated Communication.

### Statement of purpose:

This paragraph is reworded for clarity and provides the method to be used to change the Budget during the Fiscal Year.

### ARTICLE VII PETITIONS AND FEES

### **AMEND SECTION 2. FEES**

The fees required for the degrees of Ancient Craft Masonry conferred in this Lodge shall be One Hundred Thirty Five Dollars (\$135.00) together with such other fees, levies and assessments as may be required by the By-Laws and Edicts of the Grand Lodge. The Lodge requires as a minimum, at the time of petition, Ninety-One Dollars (\$91.00) together with all Grand Lodge fees, levies and assessments; Twenty Twe Dollars (\$22.00) before or at the time the Second Degree is conferred; and Twenty Twe Dollars (\$22.00) before or at the time the Third Degree is conferred.

### To read:

The fees required for the degrees of Ancient Craft Masonry conferred in this Lodge shall be One Hundred *Fifty* Dollars (\$150.00) together with such other fees, levies and assessments

as may be required by the By-Laws and Edicts of the Grand Lodge. The Lodge requires as a minimum, at the time of petition, One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) together with all Grand Lodge fees, levies and assessments; Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00) before or at the time the Second Degree is conferred; and Twenty Five Dollars (\$25.00) before or at the time the Third Degree is conferred.

### Statement of purpose:

The fees for the degrees at this lodge continue to be one of the lowest in the area. To minimize the impact of a dues increase the fees for the degrees must be increased. A fifteen dollar (\$15.00) increase is minimal and will keep our initiation fee still competitive for the area.

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### AMEND SECTION 1. DUES

Dues for this Lodge shall be <del>Twenty Two</del> Dollars (\$22.00) per annum plus the Per Capita Tax assessed for that year by the Grand Lodge, increased to the next higher even dollar figure and shall be required from each member unless remitted by a vote of the Lodge hereafter provided.

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### To read:

Dues for this Lodge shall be *Thirty Five* Dollars (\$35.00) per annum plus the Per Capita Tax and any other special assessments assessed for that year by the Grand Lodge, increased to the next higher even dollar figure and shall be required from each member unless remitted by a vote of the Lodge hereafter provided.

It has been many years since the dues have increased and operation of the Lodge has depended on the generosity of the brethren. All brethren should share operational costs of this Lodge. This increase will allow the Lodge to essentially break even. Our rent has increased from \$120.00/meeting to \$200/meeting, or a yearly increase of \$2,000.00. This increase was driven by a reduction in the number of tenants paying rent to the Building Board. Although our remaining tenants rent was also increased

there was a serious shortfall in income for the Building Board this year resulting in a plea to the brethren for help. This plea was answered favorably by the brethren for this year. As it now stands the Building Board will just break even this year. Costs for heating, air and insurance have skyrocketed and if they continue to rise so will our rent. A \$13.00 increase per year in dues is not out of line, especially when you consider this Lodge is down to 240 members.

The Proposed Changes to the Bylaws were read to the attending members at the June 23, 2005 Lodge meeting held at the Masonic Home. In accordance with the By Laws of the Grand Lodge of Missouri the proposed changes must lie over for thirty (30) days. The vote on these By Law Changes will be at the stated meeting July 28 7:30 pm at Swope Park Lodge # 617 8521 Oldham Rd Kansas City, Missouri 64138
