There have been the meetings concerning the proposal for Herione-Rockhill Lodge to merge with us, and of course, the Lodge preparing for the official DDGM and DDGL visit January 12th. I will cover these subjects in more detail as I continue. I have the petition of Danny Bartelli, the first recipient of the 1 in 10 proposal. Let me briefly explain the purpose and objective of the **ONE IN TEN PROGRAM**

Objective: Offer financial assistance to candidates for the degrees in Free Masonry

Criteria: Must have a financial need, be active in DeMolay and express a desire to participate in the Ritual and Degree work in Swope Park Lodge. Recommended by a Swope Park Master Mason and/or Advisor of the sponsored Chapter. After being raised to the sublime degree of MM, candidate agrees to join One-in-ten program within three (3) years of completing post-graduate or vocational training and being established in his profession or vocation. This assures return on the Lodges investment and continued recruiting of new members into the Craft. One-in-Ten Swope Park Lodge Participants consist of teams of ten (10) Masons who pledge \$15.00 a quarter into a dedicated account for the purpose of providing \$150.00 a quarter to cover the initiation, passing and raising of sponsored candidates.

After discussing this with the brethren of the lodge, we decided to make this available to <u>all</u> young men, not just DeMolay members. The criteria for participation remains a financial need, desire to participate in ritual and degree work and being recommended by a lodge member. Brethren...we need to invest in our future to insure the lodge is still here for our sons and grandsons. Please join me in supporting this effort. **Send the Secretary your check today, designate "1 in 10 program".**

Talks continue on the proposed merger with Herione-Rockhill Lodge. We have met a couple of times to iron out a few of the details concerning meeting date and time. I believe the real obstacle is going to be the number designation of the Lodge. It has been proposed to change it to #104 from #617. I have heard a lot of discussion both ways and they are all valid points. Our next meeting will take be February 3rd. 8:00 A.M at Swope Park Lodge, with breakfast served by Wm. F. Kuhn DeMolay. All Lodge members are encouraged to attend. If you live out of town please submit your comments beforehand to any of our lodge officers. Treasurer's Report RWB Lawrence Cameron, PM

Year End Report for FY2005

Your Lodge continues to function in a sound manner. Although the Lodge experienced some unusual expenditures this fiscal year, cash on hand was able to absorb them without accessing our savings. This was primarily due to the generosity of the Brethren of this Lodge answering the call for donations for the Building Fund and Charity. The Brethren of this lodge are to be commended for their generosity.

The budgetary projection for income versus actual was within 1.76% and disbursements were within 3.1%. The Officers continue to serve the Lodge in a financially prudent manner and are also to be commended.

The Lodge started FY2005 (Oct 1, 2004) with \$17,184.84 in checking and \$89,112.65 in savings for a combined asset of \$105,297.49. The Lodge ended FY2005 (Sept 30, 2005) with \$13,161.89 in checking and \$90,468.75 in savings for a combined asset of \$103,630.64. Actual income for FY2005 was \$12,279.88 and expenditures were \$15,337.08; a deficit of \$3,057.20.

Although the Lodge continues to remain on a sound financial footing, current trends of income/expenditures do not look favorable for the coming years. Financial support for the building continues to be our largest expense and will continue to escalate each year based on utility costs onlv. Currently your Lodge pays \$200/meeting rent or \$5,000/year. addition to the rent your lodge donated an \$3,117 additional to the Association for a combined total of \$8,117 or 53% of our total expenditures. The only other renters we have are two Eastern Star Chapters which pay a combined rent of \$180/meeting or \$4,680/year. Anticipated income for the Building Association for FY2006 is budgeted at \$9,680 and expenses are estimated to be \$14,500.

The Lodge continues to draw the interest from our savings to help offset a shortage in income. The rise in interest rates this past year should also help some but it is not nearly enough. Expenditures have been cut to as minimal as we can make them. Starting this fiscal year the dues were increased which will also help offset our yearly deficit but your Lodge still needs your help.

Last year I issued a challenge to each brother to contribute \$5/meeting or \$120/year. This challenge was answered with \$2,836.20 collected. As you can see above all those monies were spent to

support the building. I again issue the challenge brethren. We will continue to need and depend on your generosity for the coming fiscal year.

On a lighter note, there was \$602.50 collected for charity and \$925 spent. Of this amount your lodge donated \$500 to assist our brethren whom were devastated by the hurricanes this past summer.

And in closing, remember your lodge brethren and please join us in fellowship whenever you can. Your Officers are hard at work to maintain your lodge and are always encouraged by your attendance.

Dear Brothers,

We been approached by Heroin-Rockhill Lodge to merge with Swope Park Lodge #617. There are about 250 members in that lodge. They meet in our building the second Monday once a month.. There are several active members in their lodge
