

Numbers are very significant to Freemasonry. Our ritual tells us about the importance of the number combination of 3, 5, and 7. When you go beyond the Blue Lodge into the various rites you encounter more numbers and combinations. But is there a Masonic significance to the following number combination: 3, 7, 77?

This combination is very important to Masons as well as members of the Montana State Police, where the numbers are worn with pride on their shoulder patches. In the late 1800's, while Montana was still just a territory, there was a town that was suffering at the hands of outlaws. They eventually hired an outsider to be their sheriff. Instead of bringing justice, he hired a band of thugs and began a reign of terror. After months of relentless brutality the citizens had enough. A group of very prominent townsmen. many of whom were Masons, formed a vigilance committee and issued the following decree, "Any outlaw caught in the territory would be put in a grave 3 feet wide, 7 feet long, and 77 inches deep."

The committee was true to its word. Within a few months, all the outlaws were dispatched and peace was restored. The committee disbanded and the men went back to their every day lives. The Montana State Police commemorate the event by wearing those numbers: 3, 7, 77, on their uniform patches.

Masonry does not condone taking law into your own hands but is does ask its members to follow the dictates of their own conscience. When law or government fails, it falls on men of conscience to step forward and do what is necessary restore order. The same is true for our fraternity. Just something to think about as we start the New Year.

Treasurer's Report

YEAR END REPORT FY2006

The Lodge continues to financially function in a sound manner. Although the Lodge experienced some high expenditures for the building this fiscal year, cash on hand was able to absorb them without accessing the principal on our savings. This was primarily due to the brethren of this Lodge answering the call for donations for the Building Fund and Charity. The brethren of this Lodge are to be commended for their generosity. In addition the lodge was able to renew 2 of the 3 CD's for a more favorable return, and the opening of a money market account paying 4% has enhanced our income.

A deficit budget was projected for this year but actual income was up 15.7% over projections and disbursements were up 4.3% over projections. This enabled the lodge to have a close to break even year. The Officers continue to serve the Lodge in a financially prudent manner and are to be commended.

The Lodge started the fiscal year with \$13,241.89 in checking and \$90,000.00 in CD's for a combined total asset of \$103,241.89. The Lodge ended the fiscal year with \$12,926.50 in checking and \$90,000.00 in CD's for a combined total asset of \$102,926.50.

Although the Lodge continues to remain on a sound financial footing for the present time, trends based on recent history do not look favorable for the years to come. Lodge expenses continue to exceed lodge income. Financial support for the building continues to be our biggest expenditure and will continue to escalate based on utility costs only. The Lodge also continues to draw the interest from all of our savings to help offset a shortage in income.
