YEAR END REPORT FY2008

To the Worshipful Master, Officers and Brethren of Swope Park Lodge #617,

The Lodge still continues to financially function in a sound manner. The Lodge experienced some abnormal expenditures for the building this fiscal vear but cash on hand was able to absorb them without accessing the principal on our savings. This was primarily due to the brethren of this Lodge answering the call for donations for the Building Fund and Charity. The brethren of this Lodge are to be commended for their generosity. The lodge renewed all of our CD's for a lesser return than the year before and the money market account was reduced from 4% to 3%. One brother donated \$5,000 anonymously which was added to our savings to enhance our dividend income.

Actual total income for FY2008 was \$27,253.71, less the \$5,000 donation that was invested, left normalized operating income at \$22,253.71. Disbursements totaled \$23,668.63 resulting in a net loss of \$1,414.92. It should be noted that losses this year are double FY2007. The Lodge started the fiscal year with \$10,594.53 and ended the fiscal year with \$9741.40.

MAJOR EXPENSES

Rent and donations \$14,086.22 or 60% of expenses

Grand Lodge per capita plus special assessments \$ 3,502.04 or 15% of expenses

Normal lodge operating costs \$ 6,080.37 or 25% of expenses

Although the Lodge continues to remain on a sound financial footing at the present time, costs to keep the lodge doors open still continue to escalate. Lodge expenses continue to exceed lodge income. Financial support for the building continues to be our biggest expenditure and will continue to increase based on utility costs only. The Lodge continues to draw the interest and dividends from all of our savings to help offset a shortage in income. Without your continued support of extra money for the building fund our lodge will run through their savings very quickly. And if the building should suffer a major expense for maintenance, our funds will be depleted that much faster. At the present rate of operating expenses and income, the life of your lodge is estimated to be about 25 years. Add a new roof, parking lot paving, heating and air conditioning replacement, increases in utility and insurance costs

and the life span of your lodge will be shortened to 15-17 years. The lodge's Officers continue to monitor expenses very closely to see that your monies are not spent needlessly. Brethren, I know I continue to paint a bleak picture but as your Treasurer it is my duty to keep you informed. If we wait too long before the alarm is sounded it will be too late to recover. I invite you to visit your lodge, get involved and lend your help and support. Please continue to remember your lodge and contribute what you can to the building fund, remember your lodge in your will and use your lodge for any family gatherings such as birthdays, anniversaries, etc. If your employer needs an outside facility to hold a meeting, suggest that they rent your lodge. The rates are very comparable to other rentals and you will have the satisfaction of knowing that the money went to help your

- **6.** My Lodge does me a favor by calling upon me. I am not doing the Lodge a favor by serving. It is both an obligation and a privilege to help the Lodge and Freemasonry
- 7. I should treat my fellow Freemasons with the same respect, honor, and understanding that I would like to receive from them.

- **8**. It is not a right to be a Freemason; it is an honor. I should respect that honor by abiding by all of the precepts of my Lodge, my Grand Lodge, and Freemasonry as a whole.
- **9**. Whatever differences my fellow Freemasons and I may have, we are all bound together by the bonds of our loyalty to The GAOTU, our families, the Lodge, and Freemasonry.
- **10.** The willing Master Mason has the understanding that family is the life blood of the Lodge and Free Masonry.
