Greetings, Brethren! First of all, thank you

for your confidence in electing me as Worshipful Master for this year. It's been a long haul from my raising 30 years ago, but as they say, "better late than never"! Swope Park Lodge had over 450 members when I came in . Declining membership continues to be a major concern though out Masonry. We started off 2009 with 264 members and have dropped to 255 due to deaths, demits and suspensions. However, what we lack in quantity, we more than make up in quality! We have a very active line of officers coming up and we are receiving quite a few petitions for the degrees. Swope Park Lodge is a dynamic and growing lodge! We have a lot of activities planned this year as evidenced on page two. There is something for everyone who wishes to participate-socially, fund raisers, community and charitable projects and, of course, ritual. Come out any Wednesday at 7 PM to study club and improve yourself in Free Masonry and enjoy the fellowship and fun! Brethren, our temple, although in excellent condition, is at capacity for our needs. Additionally, the surrounding community has changed from when the Lodge established its home here in 1966. We need to plan for the future. We have a committee studying the feasibility, location and specifications for building a new temple possibly five years from now. If you would like to participate, call or e-mail the secretary or me at the numbers listed on page 4. Swope Park lodge moved four times between 1911 and 1966, or an average of every 14 years. We have been here 43 years, the longest time in any building in our history. A move after 2014, or over a hundred years since chartered, isn't to farfetched. Finally, Brethren: We are holding our own financially with fund raisers and donations keeping the doors open, Any serious consideration to build a new temple will require a major capital outlay. Please consider remembering your Lodge in your Will. A special New Temple Building Fund would be set up and draw interest for that day in the future when build a new temple.

He was appointed in line as Chaplain in 1980 by WB Dale Carter and served as Junior Steward in 1981 until promotion to VP of Sales required extensive travel precluding regular lodge attendance. Other Masonic affiliations, Scottish Rite, 32 degree, November 1979, Ararat Shrine, 1979 with membership in the Legion of Honor. He is Past Commander (1988) El Zaribah LOH, Phoenix, AZ., Royal Order of Jesters, created 1983, Royal Order of Scotland,1994 and most recently, Royal Arch Masons, Wm F. 
