History of Swope Park Lodge - The First 100 Years

Brethren, this is the first of four articles that will present a brief history of our lodge. I plan on having one in each issue of the Rambler.

The history of our Masonic organization can be traced to the closing weeks of the year 1910. After a great deal of planning on the part of very few men, the plan was finally instituted. Bro W. M. Clemons during a conversation with Bro Ollie J. Forris stated that he would be instrumental in establishing a lodge in the neighborhood of 56th and Swope Parkway, since the closest one was Ivanhoe Temple located at 33rd and Woodland Ave. Following this conversation Bro Forris stopped in at the drug store of Bro S. B. Moses and discussed the possibility with him. Other Masons in the area, who visited the drug store, entered the conversation and it was decided that a meeting would take place at Albert Placy Hall at 56th and Swope Parkway the next Saturday evening and that all interested Masons living in the neighborhood that could be contacted would be invited to attend. The meeting was held as scheduled with Bros W. S. Pryor, T. I. Johnson, M. C. Burns and T. W. Ferguson in attendance. Since they were unfamiliar with the procedures necessary to institute a lodge, Bro Pryor was asked to call on RWB Leon Thalman, DDGM of the 22nd Masonic District for instructions and report the following Saturday at a meeting to be held at Bro Moses drug store. At the meeting, it was announced that the waivers of jurisdiction had been obtained. Temporary officers were elected as follows: W. S. Pryor, WM; U. G. Day, SW; M. Swofford, JW; and S. B. Moses, Sec. Park Lodge U. D. A. F & A. M. was instituted at Swope Park School House located at 61st & Jackson at 8 o'clock on Friday evening, June 16, 1911. A specific session of the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of Missouri was called to order on the 3rd Degree of Freemasonry with numerous officers in attendance. The Grand Master read the order to put Park Lodge Under Dispensation to work and appointed the following officers: Bro W.S. Pryor, WM; Bro U.G. Gray, SW; Bro M. Swofford, JW; Bro J. Dalgliesh, Treas.; Bro S.B. Moses, Sec.; Bro Rev. C.C. Thompson, Chap.: Bro E.J. King, SD; Bro T.W. Ferguson, JD; Bro R.E. Fisher, SS; Bro M.C. Burns, JS; and Bro B.G. Gray, Tiler. The first meeting was held on July 21, 1911, and initiated its first candidate Dr. W. M. Clemons, MD, on, in Albert Placy Hall. The fees for the three degrees were \$40, with the annual dues of \$4. Our charter was receive from the Grand Lodge in St. Louis, Missouri and was dated September 28, 1911. Brother Dalgliesh owned a grocery store at 6704 Cleveland and lived on the second floor above it. Since is was deemed unsatisfactory to meet in a one story frame home, Bro Dalgliesh was finally persuaded to move into one of his own houses and remodel the second floor of the grocery store for use by the lodge. The first meeting at Dalgliesh Hall was held on November 1, 1911, at which time Park Lodge #617 A. F. & A. M. was constituted, consecrated and hall dedicated. All officers appointed by the Acting Grand Master on June 16th were elected or appointed at the with the exception of Tiler. The new tiler was S.L. Flacy. RWB Thalman was the Installing Master for the installation .Effective January 1, 1913, the dues were increased from \$4 to \$4.50. Peace and harmony prevailed at this location until a severe fire on August 5, 1913, destroyed the building so extensively that Lodge had to be held at Ivanhoe Temple, until the hall could be repaired. Damage estimates were \$700 on the building and \$1150 on the content, which included lodge equipment and paraphernalia. On August 20, 1913, only 15 days after the fire, WM Pryor announced that a duplicate charter had been obtained to replace the original that was lost in the fire. At the last meeting held at Ivanhoe Temple, on October 15, 1913, a motion was made and seconded and carried that the Lodge return to the Cleveland location. Effective January 1, 1922, fees for the three degrees were increased from \$50 to \$75 and dues were raised to \$6 annually. At the stated meeting of October 12, 1922, a petition was submitted to the Grand Lodge requesting permission to change the name of Park Lodge to Swope Park Lodge No. 617 for numerous reasons. The name change was also recommended by the DDGM of the 22nd District. The name change was granted to be effective on October 17, 1922. On October 16, 1923, the Grand Lodge of Missouri, then in session in Annual Communication at the Masonic Temple at 9th & Harrison, Kansas City, Missouri, suspended from labor and traveled to the site of a new temple being erected to Swope Park Lodge #617 at 60th & Swope Parkway and with full Masonic Ceremony laid the cornerstone of the building. Numerous items relating to Swope Park Lodge, Wm. F. Kuhn Chapter #139 RAM and Park Chapter #327 OES were placed in the corner box that was then placed in the corner stone .A new Swope Park Temple was erected at 60th & Swope Parkway and the lodge moved from the Lodge located at 6704 Cleveland to the new temple on October 4th, 1926. Effective July 1, 1932, fees for the three degrees were reduced from \$75 to \$65 and effective January 1, 1933, fees for the three degrees were reduced from \$65 to \$61.

RWB Paul Miller conducted the installation in due form. Following the installation, WB Charles Farris called Immediate Past Master WB Jim Payne and his grandson, Bro. Jason Newcomer to the alter and presented WB Payne with his Past Master's apron. Bro. Newcomer put it on his grandfather and presented him with a Past Master's jewel. WB Payne, in turn, presented WB Charles Farris with the Master's jewel, a gold Square, which had been handed down continuously since WB Harold Moody, PM 1978, presented it to his successor. WB Farris then presented Bro Justin Dryer the SW jewel and he, in turn, passed the JW jewel on to Bro. Ed Culver. Other presentations were: RWB Larry Cameron, presented the newly installed Master with his father's (WB Al Farris PM 1976) gavel. WM Charles Farris presented RWB Larry Cameron, outgoing Lodge Treasurer, with a certificate honoring him as Treasurer Emeritus and a proclamation as Mr. Swope Park 2010. WM Farris than presented the Junior PM with a Life time Membership in the Lodge. WB Jim Payne presented the Lodge, through the newly installed Master, with three (3) awards received at the recent Grand Lodge Communication. Swope Park Lodge won, for the first time, the coveted TRUMAN HONOR LODGE Grand Lodge award. We also received the Silver Ritual Award, for the third consecutive time, and the SAFE CHILD AWARD for sponsoring a Child Identification Event. Honored guests were then introduced. WM Farris presented his mother, Hannah Farris and his wife, Cheryl Farris, with flower bouquets. RWB Rimann gave the Benediction and WB Mel Tacke closed the Bible at the conclusion of the Installation. Dinner was served afterward downstairs in RWB Warder Shotwell Hall. The menu consisted of barbequed brisket and pork loin served with scalloped potatoes, cole slaw, rolls, cake and ice tea and coffee. We had a capacity crowd in attendance for the installation. Everyone enjoyed the ceremony and fine meal that followed.
