Master Masons who never move on to receive the Chapter degrees are thus left in limbo. They fail to learn there were two classes of Fellow Crafts in the building of the Temple and the differences between them. They fail to learn how King Solomon was inducted into the oriental chair and failed to see the temple completed.
