

As we proceed through the three degrees of the Blue Lodge, we are given a sacred duty to find "That which is lost." Have you found it? I have - twice, in fact! Freemasonry provides its initiates with two different paths in which to find it and I have traveled both. The more popular of the two is The Scottish Rite.

Over a one, two or three day Reunion, as you are conducted through the 4th through 32nd Degrees of the Rite, you find it, lose it, and then ultimately find it again in a new form. The problem with what you find is that it is based on the Scottish Rite Blue Lodge degrees which are not the degrees that the majority of the Brethren receive.

The second path is that of The York Rite and the one that is more in tune with the degrees that are conferred in Lodges throughout the United States. While like the former path, the York Rite is also divided into individual bodies. For the sake of this piece, the only one that matters is the first body: The Royal Arch Chapter. The degrees conferred by the Chapter complete the lessons that the candidate was taught in the Blue Lodge and provides him with what truly was Lost.

It has been said that every Master Mason should belong to a Royal Arch Chapter and I agree. Chapters are facing an even greater membership crisis than Blue Lodges. The newly raised Master Masons are more apt to run straight into the Shrine before anything else. While Freemasonry will always exist in some form, if we lose the Royal Arch Chapters then the entire York Rite will become extinct. When that happens, what was lost will stay lost. So I'll ask you again, have you found it?



Your lodge continues to operate in the red. Although our losses are minimal, we are doing everything in our power to keep them as low as possible. At the present time I project a \$500 loss for this fiscal year. This is due to many different driving forces out of our control; renewing our CD's at a higher interest rate, maintaining the bulk of our "on hand monies" in a 4% Money Market Account, the generosity of the brethren donating to the building fund and a new Building Board Secretary/Treasurer, Bro Jim Payne. Bro Jim has instituted many prudent procedures for building expenses. The cost for mowing and snow removal has been drastically reduced by going out on competitive bid. He also applied this to our insurance, both resulting in about a \$1200/year reduction in operating costs. The active members are trying to obtain other renters for our facility but without much response. If you have a wedding anniversary or the firm you work for needs a facility for off-site purposes, contact anyone of the line officers. Our lodge website is up and running! Be sure and read the inset in this issue for details. Brother Justin Dryer, JS, did a wonderful job creating it for our membership. We will be fine tuning it to meet future demands.

I was fortunate to be named Chairman of the committee to oversee the proposed merger of Westport Lodge into Swope Park Lodge. **WB Frank Chester** and **Bro Charles Farris, JD**, worked hard to make this transaction as smooth as possible. Your lodge voted unanimously to accept the brothers of Westport Lodge as members of Swope Park Lodge. This will become effective July 1, 2007. Our lodge membership will be increasing by 63 members. We welcome them with open arms and hope that they enjoy their membership with us.

I am very excited to see that there will be a Job's Daughters Bethel once again at our lodge. Many of our brethren were active with our old Bethel #7. **WB Gary Barron** was Associate Guardian and his spouse Beverly was Guardian as was **WB Fred Aichele** and his spouse Helen. **WB Barron** went on to become Grand Associate Guardian, and myself and my spouse Pearl served on the Guardian Council for many years. Other brethren had daughters in our Bethel and were always there to lend a helping hand. 
Master's Trelseboard (cont.)
