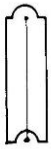

Today it is the custom to refer to the symbolic lodge of Masonry as the Blue Lodge. Many Masonic authorities advance the theory that the color blue refers to the blue sky which was the only roof or covering of the ancient lodges and also during the period of the traveling Masons or operative craft. Also it alludes to the decorations of the lodge which we find reference to in several places. Note Exodus 28, verses 36-37. "Thou shalt make a plate of pure gold and engrave upon it Holiness to the Lord, and thou shalt put in on a blue lace . . ." etc.

However the term Blue Lodge was not in use before 1770. Just when it was first used there is no record, but it definitely began after the separation of the Holy Royal Arch from the Master Masons Degree. With the separation of the degrees, the original Masonic colors, blue, purple and scarlet, were separated (Exodus 26-28), blue for the first three degrees, purple for the council degrees and scarlet for the Holy Royal Arch.

Thus, since 1785, all symbolic lodges have been called Blue Lodges.

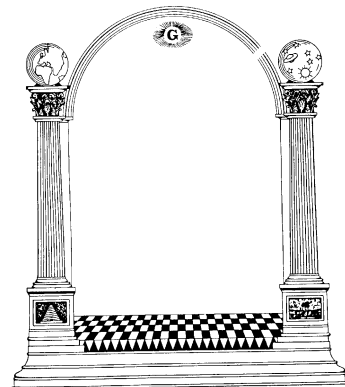

Brethren: I would like you to consider our declining membership in our fraternity as well as in our Lodge. I have been a member of this lodge thirty years. My membership card, handed to me upon giving back my MM proficiency, was number 489. Today, thanks to York and Westport lodges merging with us, we currently stand at 260 members. I shudder to think where we might be had they not merged with Swope Park. Brethren, we lose an average of twelve members annually by natural attrition. We raised five MM last year and none the year before. If we are at 260 members, lose an average of twelve and raise only an average of 2.5, and the average age of our membership is 69, you can see where we are going in 15 or so years. It is time for each of us to look around our community, church, social circles and within our extended families. Time to bring in your replacement The Lodge is doing it's part in planning meaningful activities that put Masonic values into action. We are working to apply concepts of education and self-improvement with Masonic education talks in Lodge and imparting some articles in this publication. Though various activities, we strive to Improve the environment of lodge-based fellowship; welcome new members and visitors and (cont. next column)
